### UPDATE | Search with extracts and subject area facets in ScienceDirect

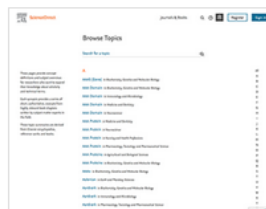

Also, users can now filter their search query based on 24 different subject areas, allowing users to narrow their search results to only the topics they are interested in.
